Wednesday June 1

Scripture Reading: 2 Chronicles 4-6
John 12:20-50

Praise the Lord! Look at Psalms 85:4 **“Restore us again, O God our Savior, and put away your displeasure towards us.”** We are working our way through the book of Psalms and this verse points out that God is the One who can restore things to us. We might be able to turn some things around but God is the One who can restore us. Thank God that He loves us.

John 12:24 says, **“I tell you the truth, unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains only a single seed. But if it dies, it produces many seeds.”** Now, this truth applies to seeds in the natural but Jesus was talking about something much more important. He was comparing His life to a seed. He willingly laid it down for us and the seed of His life produced more seeds. He gave His life so we could be born again.

Let me put this another way. God, sowed His Son and He reaped many sons as a harvest. Does this stretch you? Well, look at Galatians 3:26 **“You are all sons of God through faith in Christ Jesus.”** When we put our faith in Jesus, God made us sons of God. If a person sows corn seeds he will reap corn. If they sow flower seeds they will reap flowers. God sowed His Son as a seed and He reaped many more sons as a harvest. We need to pray and ask God to help us to live like sons of God should live. With His help we can live like He wants us to live.

Prayer: Lord, I am so thankful that I have given my life to You. I know it was the best decision I ever made. Please continue Your work of restoration in my life. Thursday June 2

Scripture Reading: 2 Chronicles 7-9
John 13:1-17

Praise the Lord! Psalms 85:5 **“Will you be angry with us for ever? Will you prolong your anger through all generations?”** Thank God that His anger was dealt with when Jesus died on the cross for our sins. God is not mad at you any more. All of God’s wrath was poured out on Jesus so we could be born again and adopted into His family. We should all say, “Thank You Jesus for dying on the cross for my sins and for bearing the curse for me!”

Why do you think Jesus washed the disciples feet? I think He washed their feet because they were dirty. Most people have never taken much time to really think about this but they had a need and Jesus met it. That is what being a servant is all about.

Now, with that in mind look at what Jesus said in John 13:17 **“Now that you know these things, you will be blessed if you do them.”** I am certainly not against foot washing services but I think this is talking about more than that alone. You see, I have been at foot washing services where there was not one dirty foot in the place. Jesus was talking about seeing people’s needs and meeting them. Let me see if I can give you a quick example of what I am talking about. Suppose there was a person who needed comfort because of a loss in their life and I were to wash their feet. I think I would have missed the point of serving them by meeting their need. So, be like Jesus and serve people by meeting the needs they have.

Prayer: Lord, I am so thankful that You died on the cross for my sins. Help me to know all that You did for me and help me to live like You want. I also see that meeting people’s needs is how I will really put Your love into action. I want to live like You want and I want my life to have a positive impact on those I serve. In Jesus’ Name, Amen.



Friday June 3

**Scripture Reading: 2 Chronicles 10-12
John 13:18-38**

Praise the Lord! Look at Psalms 85:6 **“Will you not revive us again, that your people may rejoice in you?”** When God revives us we should REJOICE! Look at what Paul wrote in Philippians 4:4 **“Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice!”** When Paul wrote that he was in jail for preaching the Gospel but God must have been reviving him anyway. You see, God can revive you anytime. He can even revive you when you are in the middle of a hard thing. When he does revive you then you need to REJOICE!

John 13:31 says, **“When he was gone, Jesus said, “Now is the Son of Man glorified and God is glorified in Him.”** Jesus said it was time for Him to be glorified. It is interesting to see what was about to happen. Jesus was about to go to the cross and die. This isn't what most people would refer to as being glorified. Here's what we need to see. Jesus was accomplishing God's will and that is always right. When Jesus accomplished God's will it brought God's glory. When we accomplish God's will it will bring God's glory as well.

Now, look at John 13:34-35 **“A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another.”** We just saw that doing God's will brings His glory. Now we are told to love one another and that will bring God's glory too!

Prayer: Lord, I am so glad for Your work in my life. Help me to rejoice more! I know that I should and I am going to do it. I also want to accomplish all of Your will for my life. I know that Your ways are always right and I want to yield to You quickly and completely. Also please bless all my brothers and sisters who are doing these devotions today. In Jesus' Name, Amen.



Saturday June 4

Scripture Reading: 2 Chronicles 13-16
John 14

Praise the Lord! Look at Psalms 85:7 **“Show us your unfailing love, O LORD, and grant us your salvation.”** This is a wonderful verse. Aren't you glad that His love is unfailing? The first part of 1 Corinthians 13:8 says, **“Love never fails!”** Listen, God's love never fails. Thank God! He loves us and He is working in our lives because of His unfailing love. Jesus' ways really are always right and they are always good for us. The more we know His will and obey what He says the better we will do in every area of our lives.

Prayer: Lord, I am thankful for Your love and for the reminder that Your love never fails. I am also thankful that You have saved me through Jesus and that there is no other Name by which men must be saved. Help me to embrace the peace that You have for me and help me to avoid the troubles and the fear that don't come from You. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

Scripture Reading: 2 Chronicles 17-19
John 15

Thursday June 9

**Scripture Reading: 2 Chronicles 29-31
John 18:1-23**

The fact that we would be saved was what gave Him joy.

Verse 11 says, **“Jesus commanded Peter, “Put your sword away! Shall I not drink the cup the Father has given me?”** We see the same thing here. Jesus was not looking for a way out of God’s will. He was committed to fulfilling all that God wanted Him to do. Thank God that He did this. We are the ones who benefitted from His total obedience.

Friday June 10

Scripture Reading: 2 Chronicles 32-33
John 18:24-40

Praise the Lord! Psalms 85:11 **“Faithfulness springs forth from the earth, and righteousness looks down from heaven.”** God is the One who is working in our lives and He will get His work done. In Philippians 1:6 Paul wrote about God’s work and He said, **“Being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus.”** God is the One who is working in our lives and He will get His work done. Now, look at a couple verses. John 18:29 **“So Pilate came out to them and asked, “What charges are you bringing against this man?”** Pilate wanted to know what the charges were. John 18:38 **“What is truth?” Pilate asked. With this he went out again to the Jews and said, “I find no basis for a charge against him.”** Pilate basically said that Jesus was innocent and yet He died on the cross for our sins. Thank God!

Prayer: Lord, I am so thankful that You are the One who is working in my life and I know that Your work is a good work. I willingly submit to You and Your plan for my life. Thank You for dying on the cross for my sins. I know that You were innocent and I was guilty. I had no hope and I have no hope outside of what You have done for me. In Jesus’ Name, Amen.

Saturday John 11

Scripture Reading: 2 Chronicles 34-36 John 19:1-22

Monday June 13

Scripture Reading: Ezra 3-5
John 20

Praise the Lord! Psalms 85:13 **“Righteousness goes before him and prepares the way for his steps.”** God is righteous and His righteousness goes before Him AND He makes us righteous. 2 Corinthians 5:21 says, **“God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.”** Jesus was sinless and God made Him to be sin for us so we could become the righteousness of God IN HIM! Please know that the only way we could be made righteous is IN HIM. That is the real key to our being righteous.

Praise the Lord for the resurrection! Death, hell and the grave could not hold Jesus. He was raised from the dead and He is alive forever more. After His resurrection He met with His disciples and look at John 20:19 **“On the evening of that first day of the week, when the disciples were together, with the doors locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, “Peace be with you!”** Jesus met with the disciples and He spoke PEACE to them.

Now, look at John 20:21 **“Again Jesus said, “Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you.”** Jesus again spoke PEACE to them. If you get the idea that Jesus has PEACE for us you are on the right track. Look at verse 26, **“A week later his disciples were in the house again, and Thomas was with them. Though the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, “Peace be with you!”**

Prayer: Lord, I know that You are always righteous and I ask You to teach me more of what it means that You have made me righteous. I accept it as truth but I need to know more of what You have done for me. I also thank You for Your PEACE. Help me to have it, walk in it and share it with others like You did. In Jesus' Name, Amen.



Tuesday June 14

Scripture Reading: Ezra 6-8
John 21

Praise the Lord! Psalms 86 is a prayer of David. Psalms 86:1 say, **“Hear, O LORD, and answer me, for I am poor and needy.”** When we know that we need help we are in a good position to come to God in prayer. When Jesus encountered people who thought they were holy on their own He let them know that they were way off track. You see, if a person thinks they are good enough on their own they won’t turn to God for help. David knew (and hopefully we know) that we need God’s help and it was a good thing for him and it is a good thing for us.

In John 21 we read about Jesus restoring Peter. Peter had denied the Lord but Jesus never denied him. Thank God that He doesn’t quit on us when we fail. I really feel like someone reading this needs this reminder. God has not quit on you and He never will. The last part of Hebrews 13:5 says, **“God has said, “Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you.”** You may have severely let Him down, like Peter did, but He hasn’t left you. He still loves you and He still wants to work in your life. I know that is true because He is speaking to you right now. Draw back to Him, ask Him to forgive you and then go on and live for Him.

Look at John 21:25 **“Jesus did many other things as well. If every one of them were written down, I suppose that even the whole world would not have room for the books that would be written.”** Thank God for His miracle working power. He had plenty of miracle working power back then and He still has plenty today.

Prayer: Lord, I am so thankful that You always hear me when I cry out to You. I know that You love me and I am grateful that You are so patient with me. I draw near to You right now and I ask You to keep me on track living for You. In Jesus’ Name, Amen.



Wednesday June 15

**Scripture Reading: Ezra 9-10
Acts 1**

Praise the Lord! Wow, Psalms 86:2 is a wonderful verse, **“Guard my life, for I am devoted to you. You are my God; save your servant who trusts in you.”** I am going to have to spend more than one day on this verse. Look at the first part, **“Guard my life.”** Thank God that He is looking out for us. If He weren't looking out for us where would we be? There are times when we see His protection and other times when we don't but He is guarding us all the time. Thank God!

Acts 1:4-5 say, **“On one occasion, while he was eating with them, he gave them this command: “Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about. For John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.”** Jesus told the disciples to wait for the baptism with the Holy Spirit. Some people don't think the baptism with the Holy Spirit is needed and others don't even think it is available but Jesus wasn't like that. He knew the baptism with the Holy Spirit was a good thing and He knew that we need it. Always keep in mind that God only has good things for us because He loves us.

Look at Acts 1:8 **“But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.”** When we are baptized with the Holy Spirit we are empowered to be witnesses! That is surely a good thing.

Prayer: Lord, I ask You to guard my life just like David prayed and I know that You will protect me. I also thank You for the Holy Spirit and I ask You to baptize me and help me to stay full. I want to be a witness for You and I thank You for Your power that comes when I am full of the precious Holy Spirit. In Jesus' Name, Amen.



Thursday June 16

Scripture Reading: Nehemiah 1-3
Acts 2:1-13

Praise the Lord! Psalms 86:2 says, **“Guard my life, for I am devoted to You. You are my God; save Your servant who trusts in you.”** Look at the second phrase of this verse, **“I am devoted to You.”** David was saying that he had given his life to God and that he was going to live for Him. That was a key to God’s blessing on David’s life and it will be a key in our lives too. Give your life to Jesus and then really live for Him. Never give up. Giving your life to Him really was the right thing to do. Now, back up your choice with your life.

Jesus told the disciples to be filled with the Holy Spirit and they were sure filled! Acts 2:4 **“All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.”** Did you notice how many of them were filled? They were ALL filled. Listen, the baptism with the Holy Spirit is for everyone. I hope you know this and I hope you allow the Holy Spirit to fill you.

When they were filled they spoke in tongues. Let me quickly remind you that God is good, He loves you and He only has good things for you. They were filled with the Holy Spirit and they spoke in tongues. Both of these things came from God and so both of these things were good. They were good back then and they are still good today because God never changes. Be filled with the Holy Spirit and speak in tongues. They are good gifts from God.

Prayer: Lord, I am glad that I have given my life to You and now I want to be devoted to You. If there are areas that I have not submitted to Your Lordship please show me and help me to yield to You. I also ask You to fill me with the Holy Spirit and help me to speak in tongues. I know that You love me and that You only have good gifts for me. In Jesus’ Name, Amen.



Friday June 17

**Scripture Reading: Nehemiah 4-6
Acts 2:14-47**

Praise the Lord! Let's look at Psalms 86:2 some more today, **"Guard my life, for I am devoted to you. You are my God; save your servant who trusts in you."** Look at the phrase, **"You are my God."** Thank God that He has revealed Himself to us. We are serving the real and living God. Jesus is the King of kings and the Lord of lords. Giving our lives to Him was the best decision we ever made. When we gave our lives to Him, He became OUR God.

Yesterday I stated that the infilling of the Holy Spirit was for all people. I know that statement stretches some people but it is still the truth. Look at Acts 2:17 **"In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your young men will see visions, your old men will dream dreams."** In the first part of Acts 2, God poured out His Spirit on the disciples and in this verse He promises to pour out His Spirit in the last days. That means it is always God's will to fill all of His people with His Spirit. Let's never reject what God has for us.

Now look at Acts 2:21 **"And everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."** There are some people who think that the infilling of the Holy Spirit passed away and that it is not for today but those same people would not do away with what this verse says. We need to take ALL of the Word. The infilling of the Holy Spirit is still for today just like calling on the name of the Lord to be saved is still for today. God hasn't changed.

Prayer: Lord, I am so glad that I have given my life to You. You are my God, and I would not have it any other way. I also thank You for ALL Your promises. I called on Your Name and I was saved. I also ask You to fill me with the Holy Spirit and I know that You will keep Your word. Thank You for saving me and filling me. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

Scripture Reading: Nehemiah 7-8
Acts 3

Praise the Lord! Psalms 86:2 **“Guard my life, for I am devoted to you. You are my God; save your servant who trusts in you.”** We are working our way through this verse and the next phrase says, **“Save Your servant.”** Thank God for His Salvation. There is no other way for us to be saved. Also notice that David calls himself God’s servant. You see, His is the Lord and we serve Him. Now it is also true that in the New Testament Jesus tells us that we are His family and His friends but we still serve Him as our Lord.

The book of Acts shows us how Spirit filled believers should be living. In the first part of Acts 3, Peter and John were going to prayer and they healed a man who had been crippled from birth. First, notice that Spirit filled believers are people of prayer. Are you? If not, perhaps you need to ask God to fill you with His Spirit. Next we read about Peter and John healing a man. Are you actively helping people to receive healing? If not, perhaps you need to ask God to fill you with His Spirit.

In case you haven’t caught my point we need to stay filled with the Holy Spirit and then we will live like God wants. Remember that Jesus said that the infilling of the Holy Spirit would empower us to be His witnesses. We see this happening in Acts and we need to be living the same way. Peter went on and shared the Gospel with those who came together because of the healing. You see, Peter was a Spirit filled believer and he was speaking the Good News with the power that God had given him.

Prayer: Lord, thank You for saving me. I know You are the only way for me to be saved and I am so thankful that You drew me to You. Help me to be filled with the Spirit and help me to stay filled. I want to be a good witness as I help others. I know that I cannot do these things without Your help. I love You! In Jesus’ Name, Amen.

Scripture Reading: Nehemiah 9-11
Acts 4:1-22

Praise the Lord! Well, let me finish up with Psalms 86:2 today, **“Guard my life, for I am devoted to you. You are my God; save your servant who trusts in you.”** The last part of this verse says that we **“Trust in God.”** This is something that I write to you over and over. Put your trust in God and keep it there. Believe me, it will make your life so much better.

When we went through the Gospels I often commented on those who opposed Jesus. He was perfectly representing God and He always did good but some people opposed Him. In Acts, we will see that some people opposed the Spirit filled believers too. Look at Acts 4:1-2 **“The priests and the captain of the temple guard and the Sadducees came up to Peter and John while they were speaking to the people. They were greatly disturbed because the apostles were teaching the people and proclaiming in Jesus the resurrection of the dead.”** The religious people didn't like them preaching Jesus.

Now look at Acts 4:18-20 **“Then they called them in again and commanded them not to speak or teach at all in the name of Jesus. But Peter and John replied, “Judge for yourselves whether it is right in God's sight to obey you rather than God. For we cannot help speaking about what we have seen and heard.”** The disciples stayed on track doing what God had called them to do. This is what we need to do if we face opposition too. Keep living for Jesus and keep doing what He wants us to do.

Prayer: Lord, I want to put and keep my trust in You and You alone. I know that You are well able to take care of me and I really appreciate it. I also want to know Your will and I want to accomplish all of Your will for my life. I know that Your ways are always right and I want to be quick to obey You. In Jesus' Name, Amen.



Monday June 20

Scripture Reading: Nehemiah 12-13
Acts 4:23-37

Praise the Lord! Psalms 86:3 says, **“Have mercy on me, O Lord, for I call to you all day long.”** Aren’t you glad for God’s mercy? His mercy means we get His blessings rather than the curse. Thank God for His mercy! This verse also talks about us calling on Him all day long. 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 say, **“Be joyful always; pray continually; give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God’s will for you in Christ Jesus.”** These things are surely examples of us calling on God all day long and they are God’s will for us!

In yesterday’s devotion, we saw that some of the religious leaders were opposing the Spirit filled believers and the message they were preaching. In our reading for today, they set the disciples free. Look at Acts 4:23 **“On their release, Peter and John went back to their own people and reported all that the chief priests and elders had said to them.”** Peter and John went to the other believers and they prayed.

Look at what they prayed, Acts 4:29, 30 **“Now, Lord, consider their threats and enable your servants to speak your word with great boldness. Stretch out your hand to heal and perform miraculous signs and wonders through the name of your holy servant Jesus.”** They prayed for more boldness so they could keep preaching the Gospel. The next verse says, **“After they prayed, the place where they were meeting was shaken. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke the word of God boldly.”** They prayed for boldness and they got boldness. Then they went right on doing what God wanted them to do.

Prayer: Lord, I am so thankful for Your mercy. Help me to know Your will and help me to have the boldness to do everything You have called me to do. In Jesus’ Name, Amen.

And all the believers used to meet together in Solomon's Colonnade.”** God was still working through His people and doing good. Verse 14 says, **“Nevertheless, more and more men and women believed in the Lord and were added to their number.”** God was using His people and many were being saved and added to the Church. It is always God's will to bless people and it is always His will for people to be saved and added to the Church.

Prayer: Lord, I am thankful for all the joy You bring into my life. Help me to really know that I can always find real joy in Your presence. I also ask You to use me more to reach out to people in need. I want to help them with Your power so they can come to know You. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

Scripture Reading: Esther 4-6
Acts 15:17-42

Praise the Lord! Psalms 86:5 **“You are forgiving and good, O Lord, abounding in love to all who call to you.”** What a wonderful verse. God is forgiving! That is a simple statement to make but it is sure important. 1 John 1:9 says, **“If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.”** God is faithful and just and He will always forgive us when we come to Him and confess our sins. Thank God!

We have talked about people opposing the Spirit filled believers before but we get some more information in our reading for today. Acts 5:17 says, **“Then the high priest and all his associates, who were members of the party of the Sadducees, were filled with jealousy.”** These people opposed them because they were jealous. You see, they thought they were super spiritual and yet the Spirit filled believers seemed to have all the power and people were joining them. Rather than following the same Jesus the Spirit filled believers were following they opposed them and persecuted them.

Look at Acts 5:40-41 **“His speech persuaded them. They called the apostles in and had them flogged. Then they ordered them not to speak in the name of Jesus, and let them go. The apostles left the Sanhedrin, rejoicing because they had been counted worthy of suffering disgrace for the Name.”** The disciples kept doing what God had called them to do. They were choosing to please God rather than people and that was the right choice.

Prayer: Lord, thank You for forgiving me. I know I was bound by sin but You have set me free. Help me to live like a Spirit filled believer who has been forgiven should live. I also want to be a better witness for You and all Your goodness. In Jesus' Name, Amen.



Thursday June 23

Scripture Reading: Esther 7-10
Acts 6

Praise the Lord! Psalms 86:5 says, **“You are forgiving and good, O Lord, abounding in love to all who call to you.”** I know this is the verse we looked at yesterday but I have some more to say about it. God is forgiving and He is GOOD! Look at Psalms 73:1 **“Surely God is good to Israel, to those who are pure in heart.”** Don’t miss this. God is good to those who are pure in heart AND He is the One who makes us pure in heart. What a wonderful God. Actually, I could say, “God is good!”

As more and more people were joining the Church the work load got greater. So, people were picked to help with the work. Acts 6:2-3 **“So the Twelve gathered all the disciples together and said, “It would not be right for us to neglect the ministry of the word of God in order to wait on tables. Brothers, choose seven men from among you who are known to be full of the Spirit and wisdom. We will turn this responsibility over to them”** Notice that those who were chosen needed to be full of the Spirit. God was working through Spirit filled believers and He is still working through Spirit filled believers today.

Now, look at Acts 6:8 **“Now Stephen, a man full of God’s grace and power, did great wonders and miraculous signs among the people.”** Stephen was one of the Spirit filled believers who was chosen to wait on tables. Now, God was using him in more ways. Stephen was faithful and his faithfulness positioned him to be used even more.

Prayer: Lord, I am so thankful that You are always good and that You always do good things for me. Help me to remember this when I need it the most. I also thank You for the reminder that I need to be faithful and that my faithfulness will position me to do even more for You. Help me to really put this into practice in my life. In Jesus’ Name, Amen.



Friday June 24

Scripture Reading: Job 1-3
Acts 7:1-19

Praise the Lord! Look at Psalms 86:5 again, **“You are forgiving and good, O Lord, abounding in love to all who call to you.”** Right in the middle of this verse we see the phrase, **“O Lord”**. It is important to remember that Jesus is Lord! He is our Savior, our Helper, our Healer and many other things but never forget that He is our Lord. That means He rules and reigns. The more we allow Him to rule and reign in our lives the better we will do.

Stephen was a man of faithfulness and he did great things for God and he was opposed by the religious leaders of the day. They arrested him and put him on trial. Look at Acts 7:1 **“Then the high priest asked him, “Are these charges true?”** I am not going to take the time to write out the charges but they are found in Acts 6:11-15 if you want to read them. I can tell you that the charges against him were not true. The people who had him arrested were just jealous of him and how God was using him. So, they wanted to shut him up.

When it was time for Stephen to respond to the charges he preached the Good News to them. Now, many people would have spent their time defending themselves but Stephen had something more important to do. Jesus had told His Spirit filled believers to spread the Gospel wherever they went and so Stephen did what Jesus wanted him to do. He preached the Gospel to them.

Prayer: Lord, it is such a privilege to have You as my Lord. I am never going to serve anyone else. I have given my life to You and now I am going to live for You and You alone. Please help me to know Your will for my life and help me to be as committed to doing Your will as Stephen was. I know that Your ways are always right. In Jesus' Name, Amen.



Saturday June 25

Scripture Reading: Job 4-6
Acts 7:20-43

Praise the Lord! Well, let's look at Psalms 86:5 again today, **"You are forgiving and good, O Lord, abounding in love to all who call to you."** God is: **"Abounding in love!"** 1 John 4:16 says, **"And so we know and rely on the love God has for us. God is love. Whoever lives in love lives in God, and God in him."** Did you notice the part I underlined in that verse? **God is love!** No wonder He abounds in love since He is love. We are so blessed to be serving God. He is love and He loves us. Thank God!

Yesterday, we talked about how Stephen was a faithful man and how there were some who opposed him. Look at 2 Timothy 3:12 **"In fact, everyone who wants to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted,"** You see, there are some people who love the darkness more than the light. So, they want to do away with anyone who spreads the light. We have already seen that they are often jealous. The next verse in 2 Timothy says, **"While evil men and impostors will go from bad to worse, deceiving and being deceived."** These evil men persecute those who are living righteously and they just keep getting worse and worse.

Now, think about what Stephen did when he was faced with these people. He kept preaching the Good News. He knew that was what God had called him to do and he was being faithful to the One who was most important. Matthew 5:11-12 **"Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me. Rejoice and be glad, because great is your reward in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you."**

Prayer: Lord, I thank You for Your love. Help me to live fully for You and not be distracted by what people think. I want to please You more than anything else. In Jesus' Name, Amen.



Sunday June 26

Scripture Reading: Job 7-9
Acts 7:44-60

Praise the Lord! Well, let's look at Psalms 86:5 one more time, **"You are forgiving and good, O Lord, abounding in love to all who call to you."** God is forgiving, good, abounding in love **TO ALL WHO CALL ON HIM.** Look at Acts 4:12 **"Salvation is found in no-one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to men by which we must be saved."** The only way to be saved is to call on Jesus and all who call on Him will be saved. Thank God that He has provided such a wonderful way for us to be saved and thank God that we have called on Jesus.

Look at Matthew 5:10 **"Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven."** Now I know we are studying through the book of Acts but Stephen was a righteous man, he was persecuted because of righteousness and he ended up in the kingdom of Heaven. The same Jesus who greeted Stephen into Heaven said these words in Matthew.

When we give our lives to Jesus it doesn't mean we will never face anything hard. We might even face persecution but Jesus promises to be with us. We never have to face anything alone and we are going to end up with Jesus forever. None of us want to face hard things but when you stack them up in comparison to heaven they aren't so important. Stephen was a faithful man and when he was killed he went immediately into the presence of Jesus and he will be there forever.

Prayer: Lord, I am so glad that I have called on You and You have saved me. I know that my future is bright because of You. Even if I have to go through some hard things here I will be with You forever and that is way more important than the hardships I face here. Help me to live my life in a way that will lead others to You. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

Scripture Reading: Job 10-12
Acts 8:1-25

Praise the Lord! Psalms 86:6 says, “**Hear my prayer, O LORD; listen to my cry for mercy.**” Look at Jeremiah 33:3 “**Call to me and I will answer you and tell you great and unsearchable things you do not know.**” When we call on God He hears us and He helps us to understand things that we couldn’t otherwise have understood. If promises like this motivate you to pray more it is a good thing. If they don’t motivate you to pray more then you probably need to read them more.

When Stephen was stoned to death there was a man there consenting to his death. That man was Saul who would later become the Apostle Paul. How could a person like Saul be saved? He could be saved the same we you and I were. Acts 4:12 “**Salvation is found in no-one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to men by which we must be saved.**” We had to call on the Name of Jesus to be saved and Saul had to do the same thing. Whenever anyone (yes that included Saul) calls on the Name of Jesus they will be saved. All of us are saved because Jesus died on the cross to open up salvation to all who would call on His Name.

Look at Acts 8:22 “**Repent of this wickedness and pray to the Lord. Perhaps he will forgive you for having such a thought in your heart.**” Peter was telling this man that he could be forgiven by calling on the Name of Jesus too. Listen, Jesus in the One Way to the Father and He extends salvation to any person who will put their faith in Him.

Prayer: Lord, I am so thankful that You always hear me when I call upon You. Thank You, Jesus, for dying on the cross for my sins and bringing me to the place where I put my trust in You. Help me to know that Your sacrifice has opened up salvation for every person who will put their faith in You. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

It is also kind of interesting that Philip evidently didn't even know why he was going but while he was on his way he found out.

Now, let me give you a verse. John 10:27 **“My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me.”** You belong to Jesus and He is speaking to you. Tune in to what He is saying and obey Him. Many times you will find out why you are doing what you are doing along the way. Just keep trusting Him.

Prayer: Lord, I am so glad that I can call on You all the time. I am especially glad that I can call on You when I am in need. Help me to hear what You are saying to me and help me to be quick to do just what You ask me to do. I don't want to miss out on anything You have for me. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

Saul is now saved, healed and filled with the Holy Spirit. Don’t miss this. Saul had been persecuting Spirit filled believers. When he played his part in killing Stephen who was a Spirit filled believer Stephen prayed for him to be forgiven for what he was doing. Now, Saul meets Jesus, gives his life to Him and becomes a Spirit filled believer just like Stephen. Isn’t God wonderful?

Prayer: Lord, I know that You are God and there are no other gods like You. I know You are God because of the changes You have made in my life and I love You. I am glad that Jesus came to seek and to save sinners and I am glad that included me. Please help me to be filled with the Spirit and help me to live like a Spirit filled believer should live. In Jesus’ Name, Amen.



Thursday June 30

Scripture Reading: Job 19-20
Acts 9:23-43

Praise the Lord! Look at Psalms 86:8 again, **“Among the gods there is none like you, O Lord; no deeds can compare with yours.”** There is no god like the real God and this verse also said why we can know this is true. None of those other gods can do anything like our God can do! Our God can save us, heal us, and make huge changes in our lives. The changes God brings into our lives are always good. You see, some of those other gods who have demons acting on their behalf can change people but they are always changed for the worse. Thank God we serve the one real God who loves us and makes us into better people.

Look at Acts 9:23 **“After many days had gone by, the Jews conspired to kill him,”** Paul was now being persecuted just like he had persecuted others. Look at the next verse, Acts 9:24 **“but Saul learned of their plan. Day and night they kept close watch on the city gates in order to kill him.”** These people were trying to kill Paul but God was protecting him. Aren't you thankful for God's protection?

Acts 9:31 says, **“Then the church throughout Judea, Galilee and Samaria enjoyed a time of peace. It was strengthened; and encouraged by the Holy Spirit, it grew in numbers, living in the fear of the Lord.”** There were times when the persecution was intense and there were times when the Church had peace but the Spirit filled believers kept doing what God had called them to do. They kept preaching Jesus all the time.

Prayer: Lord, I am so thankful for all of Your mighty deeds that I have seen. Thank You for working mightily in my life and in the lives of others. I know that You are God!
